
Now that we have had another successful KPAD, I'd like to return my attention to the President's Message.



Each accurately described the item from his/her individual viewpoint, and all missed the fact that they were standing next to an elephant.

Lloyd Enoch - We were saddened to learn of the passing of Kiwanis Club of Roanoke Past President Lloyd Enoch during the night. He was 88. Lloyd had been in declining health in recent years, but just this past April was able to attend the dedication of the Charles Day Technical Education Center where Lloyd was recognized with the naming of the social area/courtyard in his honor.

Moving to Roanoke in the mid-1960s ("as soon as I could," Lloyd liked to say), he was a lifelong educator. Lloyd worked in administrative positions with Roanoke City Schools the balance of his career. He joined Kiwanis because he was so impressed with our club's Career and Technical Awards, a project Lloyd ultimately chaired for many years.

A member of the Kiwanis Club of Roanoke since 1991, Lloyd was

president in 2003-04 and served as secretary-treasurer for about a decade shortly thereafter. He also was presented a Kiwanis International Hixson Award and served two terms as Division 15 Lt. Governor.

Lloyd's memorial service will be held at Oakey's South at 2 p.m. Thursday, June 6. Visitation will precede the service from noon until 2 p.m. and internment at Evergreen Burial Park will follow the service.

Lloyd's survivors include his wife, Rita, a former member of the club; his son, Lloyd, Jr. of West Virginia; a stepson, Jake Gilmore; two grandsons, two great-granddaughters and two sisters.
