



Mack Cooper

We were saddened to learn of the passing of former Kiwanian Mack Cooper, who died peacefully at his home yesterday, according to his longtime neighbor and Kiwanis sponsor Eric Danielsen.

Mack was a very active Kiwanis Club of Roanoke member from 2000-06, serving on the board of directors during that period and making an indelible impression on those Kiwanians who knew him, which were most. Mack was a most effective KPAD sales chairman, regularly whipping the club into a frenzy with his motivational weekly reports. KPAD, which started just a few years before Mack joined Kiwanis, grew significantly during Mack's involvement.

Past President Manly Aylor has known and appreciated Mack since their Roanoke Jaycee days dating to the 1980s.

For a long time, Mack oversaw G&M Upholstery in Wasena, a family business that his father, Mack Cooper, Sr., owned and operated after going to work there as an apprentice in 1946.

Details on Mack Jr.'s services are not complete at this time. Sympathies go out to his family and friends.



Former Kiwanian Bill Magee attended the July presentation by Nelson Harris at Brandon Oaks.






Below are a few highlights from Dave and Cheri Hartman's experience at the Kiwanis Convention in Denver. The last photo is district 15 folks at the convention.
















DUCKY DERBY TICKETS ON SALE

Summary of Kiwanis Club of Roanoke Board Meeting on July 8, 2024

13 attended; O'Brochta presided from Edinburgh, Scotland

1) Montgomery read two notes from this year's scholarship winners, one who is going to William and Mary and the other going to Princeton.

- 2) We presently have 149 members with 2 applications in the pipeline.
- 3) Cheri reported that Kiwanis International dues are going up \$25 per year.

This increase was approved by 80% of the delegates to the recent convention.

4) Our club is partnering with the Chamber to sponsor a Mayor Candidates Forum on October 1st.

5) There will be a ribbon-cutting at the Roanoke Star for our auction winner, Bower Heating and Air Conditioning, on July 25th at 10am. Attend if you can!

on September 14th as part of the \$1,000,000 grant that was awarded.
